RULES OF DECORUM

The following are excerpts from the West Covina Municipal Code:

Sec. 2-48. Manner of addressing council; time limit; persons addressing may be sworn.

- a. Each person addressing the council shall step up to the rostrum, shall give his or her name and city of residence in an audible tone of voice for the record and unless further time is granted by the council, shall limit his or her address to five (5) minutes.
- b. The city council may establish a limit on the duration of oral communications.
- c. All remarks shall be addressed to the council as a body and not to any member thereof. No person, other than the council and the person having the floor, shall be permitted to enter into any discussion, either directly or through a member of the council, without the permission of the presiding officer. No question shall be asked of a councilmember except through the presiding officer.
- d. The presiding officer may require any person to be sworn as a witness before addressing the council on any subject. Any such person who, having taken an oath that he or she will testify truthfully, willfully and contrary to such oath states as true any material matter which he knows to be false may be held to answer criminally and subject to the penalty prescribed for perjury by the provisions of the Penal Code of the state.

Sec. 2-50. Decorum--Required.

- a. While the council is in session, the members shall preserve order and decorum, and a member shall neither, by conversation or otherwise, delay or disrupt the proceedings or the peace of the council nor interrupt any member while speaking or refuse to obey the orders of the council or its presiding officer, except as otherwise herein provided.
- b. Members of the public shall not willfully disrupt the meeting or act in a manner that actually impairs the orderly conduct of the meeting. For the purposes of this code, "willfully disrupt" includes, but is not limited to, continuing to do any of the following after being warned by the Mayor that continuing to do so will be a violation of the law:
 - a. Addressing the Mayor and City Council without first being recognized.
 - b. Persisting in addressing a subject or subjects, other than that before the Mayor and City Council.
 - c. Repetitiously addressing the same subject.
 - d. Failing to relinquish the podium when directed to do so.
 - e. From the audience, interrupting or attempting to interrupt, a speaker, the Mayor, a council member, or a staff member or shouting or attempting to shout over a speaker, the Mayor, a council member or a staff member.
 - f. As a speaker, interrupting or attempting to interrupt the Mayor, a council member, or a staff member, or shouting over or attempting to shout over the Mayor, a council member, or a staff member. Nothing in this section or any rules of the council shall be construed to prohibit public criticism of the policies, procedures, programs, or services of the City or of the acts or omissions of the City Council. It shall be unlawful to violate the provisions of this Section.

If any subsection, sentence, clause, or phrase or word of this Section 2-50 is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Section. The City Council hereby declares that it would have passed this section and each subsection, sentence, clause and phrase thereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more subsections, sentences, clauses, phrases or words had been declared invalid or unconstitutional.

Sec. 2-52. Persons authorized to be within council area.

No person, except city officials, their representatives and members of the news media shall be permitted within the rail in front of the council chamber without the express consent of the council.

The following are excerpts from the Penal Code

148(a) (1) Every Person who willfully resists, delays, or obstructs any public officer, peace officer, or an emergency medical technician, as defined in Division 2.5 (commencing with Section 1797) of the Health and Safety code, in the discharge or attempt to discharge any duty of his or her office or employment, when no other punishment is prescribed, shall be punished by a fine not exceeding one thousand dollars (\$1,000), or by imprisonment in a county jail not to exceed one year, or by both that fine and imprisonment.

403 Every person who, without authority of law, willfully disturbs or breaks up any assembly or meeting that is not unlawful in its

character, other than an assembly or meeting referred to in Section 303 of the Penal Code or Section 18340 of the Elections Code, is guilty of a misdemeanor.

FISCAL EMERGENCY

RECOMMENDATION:

That the City Council adopt the following resolution:

RESOLUTION NO. 2020-46 - A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WEST COVINA, CALIFORNIA, DECLARING A FISCAL EMERGENCY

BACKGROUND:

On March 19, 2020, Governor Newsom issued Executive Order N-33-20 ordering all individuals living in the State of California to stay home or at their place of residence except as needed to maintain continuity of operations of critical infrastructure sectors, effective March 19, 2020, and in effect indefinitely until rescinded by the Governor. This Emergency has required the temporary closure of all non-essential businesses in the City and cancellation of all events. West Covina has 3,278 licensed businesses, many of which have been closed since mid-March. This Emergency has drastic financial implications for the City's operating budget that relies on sales tax, property tax and transient occupancy tax (TOT) revenue generated by the City's various retail businesses, restaurants, and hotels.

The City's top three sources of General Fund revenues as projected in the current 2019/20 fiscal year budget are identified as follows:

Source	Revenue
Property Taxes	\$26,680,000
Sales Tax	\$16,900,000
TOT	\$1,855,000
Total	\$45,435,000

The reductions in revenue are impacting all levels of government - Federal, State, County and City. On May 15, 2020, the County Auditor-Controller's Office notified the City of West Covina that property tax remittance due June 1, 2020, would be reduced by an undetermined amount. That same day the Successor Agency, which oversees the wind down of the former redevelopment, was also notified that RPTTF (Redevelopment Property

Tax Transfer Fund) payments would be reduced. Delayed remittances along with reduced sources of other revenues is impacting the City.

DISCUSSION:

Over the past year the City Council has taken steps to reduce expenditures by contracting building and safety services and public works functions. More recently, the City Manager has implemented a hiring freeze and frozen all purchases not related to public safety. These steps have helped but the City has experienced a five-year downward trend in unassigned fund balance, which are monies that are unencumbered. To proactively address this issue it has become necessary for the City to declare a fiscal emergency and to empower the City Manager to take all necessary to meet with labor groups and outside vendors to address the matter.

OPTIONS:

The City Council has the following options:

- 1. Adopt a resolution declaring a fiscal emergency.
- 2. Provide staff alternative direction.
